
But the apprenticeship system needs to do more to realise its social mobility potential

Our research has found that:

- The apprenticeship levy has funded more higher-level apprenticeships that were more likely taken up by learners from privileged backgrounds.
- Disadvantage gaps exist for working class apprentices at every stage of the journey.
- COVID-19 has further exacerbated these dynamics.




So many of you have asked us what you can do to support social mobility through apprenticeships - this toolkit is our answer
